

President's report EUNOS 2015 – 2017:

Since the Ljubljana meeting organized by Marko Hawlina in June 2015 the new council dealt with issues such as transferring the current website to a new one that should be more suitable to handle all topics the Society needs. After some difficulties this was achieved. Moreover, the website has an appealing new look with a new logo.

The membership is growing, both due to activation of previous members to subscribe through the new website and due to recruitment of new members, see the Secretary's report by Fion Bremner.

To make membership even more attractive a good contract was achieved with Taylor & Francis to include Neuro-Ophthalmology into the membership package and make it thus the official Journal of EUNOS. Beginning in 2018 all members will receive both the digital and the print version of this Journal that is listed in PubMed.

In June 2016 the Practical Neuro-Ophthalmology Course near Zurich, Switzerland was organized by Konrad Weber and Jonathan Trobe, serving as the EUNOS update meeting. It was very well attended by over 100 mainly younger ophthalmologists and neurologists.

At the SOE Meeting in Barcelona in 2017 six sessions were dedicated to neuro-ophthalmology. They were organized by Shlomo Dotan, the former chair of the Education Committee. Similarly, neuro-ophthalmology sessions were offered at large European Neurology meetings, organized by EUNOS members.

The research committee was very active under the leadership of Susanne Trauzettel-Klosinski, see her committee's report.

The planning of the 2017 biennial meeting in Budapest, organized by Gabriela Szatmary and her team, was another activity in which the president and members of the Council were actively involved.

We have more topics on our agenda, such as an increase in membership and involvement of members in Committees, with the goal to advocate neuro-ophthalmology throughout Europe and beyond.
